- Cite all sources Even when paraphrasing.
- Keep track of references while researching.
- Use plagiarism checkers before submitting work.



Dr. Chitra Bhattacharya is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Microbiology at Atmiya University, Rajkot, Gujarat. She holds a Ph.D. in Microbiology, an M.Phil. in Bioscience, and an M.Sc. in Microbiology. Her research interests include Plant Growth-Promoting Rhizobacteria (PGPR), environmental microbiology, bioprocess technology, and microbial applications in agriculture and waste management.

Dr. Bhattacharya has contributed to various research projects and publications. Her work encompasses the development of biocontrol agents, exploration of PGPR strains, and the application of microbial technology for sustainable agriculture. She has also been involved in projects funded by organizations such as the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), BIRAC, and the Gujarat State Biotechnology Mission (GSBTM).

Author of the Month William Shakespeare

William Shakespeare was born on April 23, 1564, in Stratford-upon-Avon, England. He was the third of eight children born to John Shakespeare, a glove maker, and Mary Arden. Little is known about his early education, but he likely attended the local grammar school.

He married Anne Hathaway in 1582 and had three children. By the early 1590s, Shakespeare had moved to London, where he gained fame as a playwright and actor. He was associated with the Globe Theatre and wrote famous tragedies (Hamlet, Macbeth), comedies (As You Like It, Twelfth Night), and histories (Henry IV, Richard III).


He retired to Stratford around 1613 and died on April 23, 1616. His legacy lives on through his timeless works, which continue to shape literature and theatre.

Understanding India's Copyright Law

India's copyright framework is governed by the Copyright Act, 1957, which has been amended multiple times, most notably in 2012

Key Definitions:

- Copyright: A legal right granting creators control over the use of their original works, including reproduction, distribution, and adaptation.
- Work: Includes literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic creations, as well as cinematograph films and sound recordings.
- Author: The individual who creates the work. In cases of employment, the employer may hold the copyright unless otherwise agreed.

Duration of Copyright:

- Literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works: Lifetime of the author plus 60 years.
- Cinematograph films and sound recordings: 60 years from publication

Rights Conferred:

- Reproduction of the work.
- Public performance or communication.
- Adaptation and translation.

These rights ensure creators can control and benefit from their works.

S Exceptions – Fair Dealing:

Certain uses are permitted without infringement, such as:

- Private or personal use, including research.
- · Criticism or review.
- Reporting of current events.
